PAST PROVISION

20schemes is the joint ministry of two local churches, Niddrie Community Church in Edinburgh, Scotland, & Redeemer Fellowship Church, Bardstown, USA. It is often mistaken as a para-church organisation when, in reality, it is the church planting and revitalisation ministry of both churches.

I (Mez) first had the vision for what is now 20schemes in 2009 when I came across a newspaper article concerning the fifty poorest housing schemes in Scotland. I read the article and began thinking about the impact a gospel church would have in each of those communities.







20schemes was officially launched in November 2012 in the kitchen of the Niddrie Community Church manse by Sharon Dickens, Matthew Spandler-Davison & myself. We had less than £500 in the bank and a dream to reach Scotland's poorest communities with the gospel of Jesus.

The early years were very tough because nobody had heard of us and those that did thought that we were a passing fad. Many churches across the UK were wary of supporting us and, although we gained some support from faithful Scottish & UK Christians, the majority of our giving came from the USA.

I began to travel around the country speaking about the vision of the ministry. Many people were sympathetic to the work, but that emotion didn't translate into hard cash or volunteers. This led us to turn to the USA and this is where Matthew Spandler-Davison stepped in to help us recruit and raise money. Mark Dever and 9marks were massively helpful to us during this time by promoting our ministry and giving me opportunities to speak at some major conferences. Slowly, but surely, we started to gain a little momentum as more Christians rallied to our cause and began to support us financially and prayerfully.

We have been through some lean and trying times and we have skirted the abyss of financial meltdown on more than one occasion. Yet, through it all God has used these times to deepen our faith and dependence upon Him. Here we are 10 years later, still skirting the abyss, but alive and functioning to the glory and praise of His name!

What I know for certain is that 20schemes would not exist without God. That's a given. But, it also wouldn't exist without the encouragement of men and women from around the globe who didn't squash our vision, or throw cold water over it.

Instead, they prayed for us, gave to us, and visited us to encourage the work. There are those who give sacrificially to do the work, and there are those who have given enormous sums over the past decade to make what we do a reality.



We also have to give thanks to the efforts of the backroom staff in both the UK and the USA who work tirelessly at all the administrative jobs, allowing the planters and gospel workers to get on with the job. Nobody fundraises for accountants, office staff and those who spend countless hours answering legal questions about visas and employment law. Yet, they silently work to make 20schemes happen.

If you are with us for our 10th Anniversary then know that many of those seated around you did not know Jesus ten years ago. There were no Christians who could meet up to worship God in their respective communities. Every church planted and revitalised is a miracle. Every soul saved is a miracle. Every cynic who thought it would never work, but now joyously celebrate with us, is a miracle. Every new church is evidence of God's wisdom and power and glory. As I look back I do so with gratefulness and amazement, and sometimes even slight disbelief.

Today we have over 100 churches and 1,000 individuals who faithfully and sacrificially give their time and money to support the work of planting churches in Scotland schemes. Over 300 people have been on vision trips, mission trips, and internships in Scotland schemes, providing a valuable helping hand to our church plant teams. PRESENT SITUATION

In the last decade we have revitalised or planted churches, including Niddrie Community Church, across Edinburgh, Glasgow, Dundee and Inverness. We currently employ sixty people across two continents, whose energy, drive and focus is fixed on our mission to reach Scotland's poorest with the gospel of Jesus.

Churches

To date, we have either planted or revitalised churches in eleven schemes across Scotland.





Training

We have theologically trained men and women who are now engaged in gospel work across Scotland.

More than a dozen books available in seven languages that have sold hundreds of thousands of copies.





Music

20schemes Music writes songs for the church in hard places that point us to the gospel.

Women

Across Scotland women are being trained, discipled & equipped to serve in their local church.



Retrain

A back-to-work ministry that will one day finance indigenous interns for future church planting ministry.





Inspired

We have inspired and supported similar ministries in England, Canada, America, and Africa.

Ragged School of Theology

Training indigenous people to become greater servants of Jesus in the local church or serve in ministry.

Our partnership with CiHP means men & women are being trained for ministry in over 30 countries.



FUTURE VISION

I am often asked what we will do if and when we hit 20 schemes. My answer is, 'I will let you know when we get there!' One thing is for certain, there will never not be a need for gospel churches in Scotland's poorest communities. Glasgow and its greater area alone, have just short of 100 schemes, the vast majority without the settled Christian witness of a local church. The need for pastors, planters and gospel workers remains as critical as it did when we began this ministry.

At the time of writing we have planting teams ready to go in several schemes in Glasgow and another in Edinburgh. We have decided to focus our attention heavily on Glasgow for the next 5 years, and to that end have established a hub in Hope Barlanark to cover the west of Scotland, directed by Pete Stewart.



When you talk about working class communities in Scotland, you can't not talk about Glasgow and the West. Glasgow alone has 97 schemes and when you move out through the surrounding regions there are hundreds more. These are all communities full of characters but they are also places of much need. We know, however, that the biggest problem is the lack of healthy gospel churches.

This is why we have said we are going to focus, primarily although not exclusively, on Glasgow and the West of Scotland for the next 10 years, and to that end we have recently set up our 'West of Scotland' Hub.

Hope Community Church Barlanark (which we planted in the first wave of 20schemes churches) is the base of our training and resourcing here, but we are already working towards planting new churches in Maryhill, Onthank and Baillieston, and revitalising a church in Kilwinning. We are also developing partnerships for church plants in Govan and Lambhill and revitalisations in Harestanes and Port Glasgow.

We are also in the planning phase of a Highland Hub, to expand on our work started by Chris Davidson in the scheme of Merkinch.

The Highlands has a rich history and, at one time, was a stronghold of gospel preaching. However, the situation is now dire. Not only are churches closing, but they are also ageing out with the migration of younger people to cities for university or work prospects, coupled with a stark shortage of people involved in gospel ministry.

These factors make the Highlands hard ground, not to mention the challenges of the geography posed by the Highlands, which is 33 per cent of the land area of Scotland. The impact of geography means that poverty is integrated and less identifiable in rural communities than in a traditional urban scheme setting.

20schemes' vision for the Highlands is to help revitalise and plant churches with contextualised training. It is a practical outworking of training in a context relevant to each church or plant. Resourcing teams to go into some of the most challenging spiritual grounds and understand the Highland scheme context. To be aware of the pitfalls of historic pains and brokenness.

Simply put the need is great for the Highlands, but we have a great gospel.



We are still looking for men and women of all ages and skillsets to come to the schemes of Scotland and to give their lives to the work of the gospel in these dark and needy places. We need more money, more people, and more prayer. This mission field really is ripe for harvest. Therefore, we must keep pushing forward for the sake of the gospel and the holy name of our God.

One of the ways I encourage all of our planters is by reminding them to look up from their own schemes from time to time and rejoice in what God is doing in schemes across Scotland. People are being saved as the gospel is being preached. It's the way it's always been and it's the way it will always be. We have no grand strategies other than proclaiming the good news of Jesus to the least, the last and the lost, discipling the saved, and equipping them for future service.







Somebody asked me recently if I thought 20schemes will outlast me. I hope so, otherwise I've been doing it wrong. It will last just as long as God wants it to last. It will last as long as faithful men and women refuse to let the apathy of the wider church discourage them from our Scottish mission field.
